1<sup>st</sup> Item. I commend my spirit to God, and request of my Executors, the decent burial of my body.

2<sup>nd</sup> Item. I direct the payment of all my just debts and the expenses of administration.

3<sup>rd</sup> Item. All my land and other property of every kind, not hereto before disposed of, including debts due, I give devise and bequeath to my wife, Mary and my children, Elizabeth M. Mafenburg wife of William A. Mafenburg, Lucy A. Biggs wife of Hader Biggs, Virginia Monecock, wife of John D. Monecock, Helen Daughtry, wife of William H. Daughtry, James L. Myrick and Walter

B. Myrick, to be equally divided, between  
them, and one seventh part thereof to  
each of them, and their respective heirs  
and assigns for his and their only proper  
use and behoof forever.

4<sup>th</sup> Item and Last - I hereby revoke all  
other wills, and for the due execution  
of the Trusts of this do nominate and  
appoint my sons in law, William C.  
Kapsenburg, Hader Biggs, John B. Monrook  
and William H. Daughtry, Executors...
